Clear Levies From District

All past-due "acquisition and improvement" levies under the Mattoon Act for A. & I. District No. 217, Amelia and 220th street in the Shoestring strip are now cleared from the records, it was learned this week from county offices. This clearance however does not pertain to general taxes and other assessments on the district between Normandie and Main street.

It is also reported that petitions containing 51.3 percent of the taxpayers in the district along Normandie between Gardena and Harbor City have been filed for clearance of A. & I. Mattoon Act levies on that area which embraces some 1,400 acres in District No. 70.

The proceedings to clear the A. & I. charges on this district have been instituted before the county board of supervisors.

Fire Prevention Week Is Fixed

The President of the United States has proclaimed the week beginning October 3, 1937 as Fire Prevention Week. In his proclamation he invites the cooperation of everyone to the end that the nation's fire losses be reduced.

Although there has been a decline in the fire loss for five years, this record was marred in 1936 by an increase from the preceding year of more than \$28,000,000, bringing the total destruction by fire in 1936 to \$263,259,746, 11.9 percent above the 1935 figure. Moreover, in 1936 more than 10,000 persons were burned to death or lost their lives as a result of fires and many thousands more were injured. The nation's fire waste is chiefly due to carelessness and the important lesson that should be taught during Fire Prevention week is the need for exercising care at all times.

Long Beach Thanks City for Support

A letter of appreciation to the city officials who, at the recent San Jose convention of the League of California Municipalities, supported Long Beach in its effort to obtain the 1938 state gathering, was read to the city council Tuesday night.
