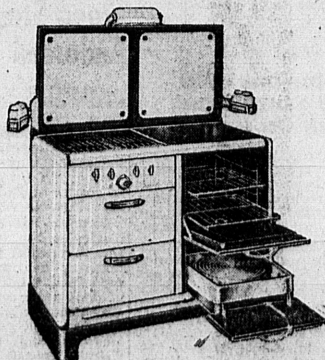

County Teachers' Institute Trips Begin Saturday

Oil refineries, dairies, newspaper plants and other plants and business establishments will be visited by the 4,000 elementary and secondary teachers of Los Angeles county during the annual institute which opens Oct. 9, next Saturday.

Teachers will be required to attend the institute field trips, mostly at the end of the week, as a part of their "instruction in the art of teaching," as required under the state's school code. The first session will be held in the Philharmonic auditorium, at which A. R. Clifton, county school superintendent, will preside.

One City Session

In contrast to the county's institute, which will not end until December, the teachers' institute for the Los Angeles city school system will consist of but one session this year, according to Vierling Kersey, superintendent of schools.

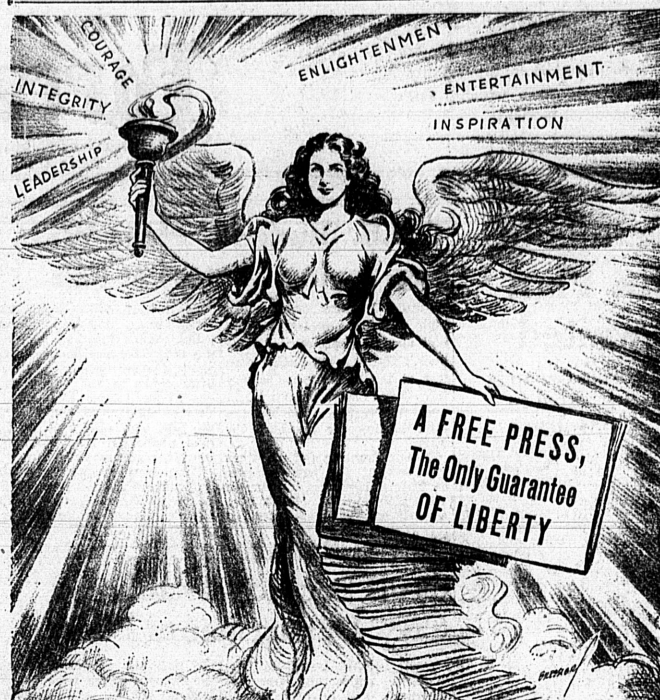
The county's institute will consist of round table discussions, demonstrations, laboratory workshop meetings and symposiums in addition to the usual lectures, Clifton said. Field trips will also include steel mills, bakeries, meat packing plants, glass and clay making plants, telephone exchanges, the planetarium at Griffith Park, Los Angeles harbor, the county jail, courtroom and hospitals.

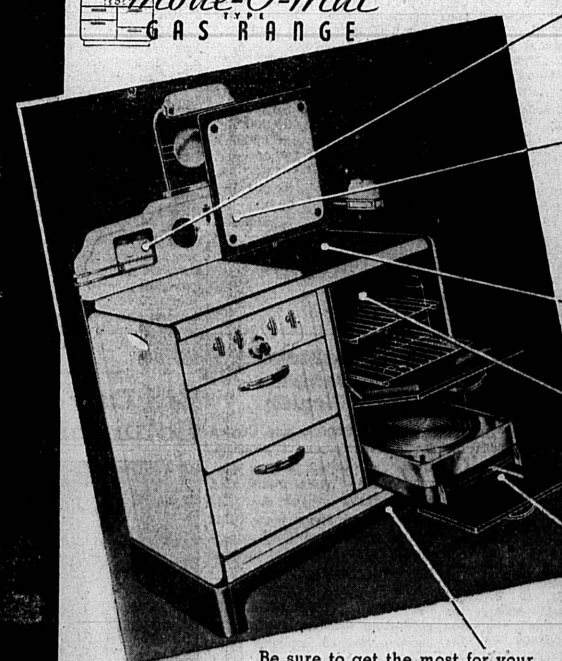

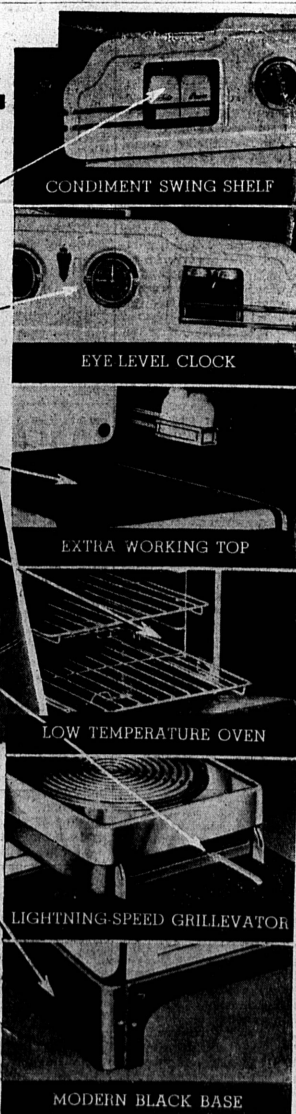
