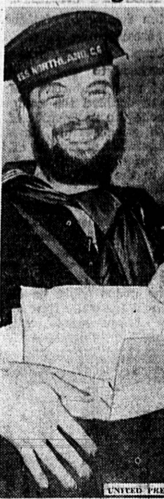

Plasterer Urges Higher Licenses

Tom Watson, local plastering contractor, addressed the city council last night relative to certain changes he thought should be made in the city's building code and licensing laws. He urged that non-combustible lath and plaster be allowed in garages connected to homes instead of the more costly metal-lath and cement plaster. Watson also urged a higher license fee for plasterers "for protection to local men against outsiders."

No action was taken on his suggestions but City Engineer Frank R. Leonard was asked to investigate the garage plastering change and report to the council at the next meeting. The matter of license fees has been a "sore-spot" here for some time. Some local mechanics want higher "protective tariffs" while prospective builders in Torrance claim that the high licenses keep out legitimate competition.
