Special services and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament all day will mark the observance of the Feast of Christ the King at the Catholic Church of the Nativity here next Sunday, according to Rev. Father Joseph V. Fitzgerald.

"Each of us should try and enroll ourselves under the banner of the Kingship of Christ," the local priest said. "On Monday the Feast of All Saints, a holy day of obligation, will be observed with Masses at 6 and 8 a. m.

The Feast of All Souls will be celebrated next Tuesday, Nov. 2. Father Fitzgerald pointed out that "this is a day on which all should remember our beloved dead" and quoted the Scripture "It is holy and the wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins."




