### Ranks Thinned of War Great 19 Years After

PARIS, Nov 11 (U.P.) -Nine-

A survey of military statistics showed that the soldlers
themselves fared better, and
that out of the 22,000,000 men
who went to war more than
11,000,000 veterans of that conflict are still alive.

Of the great political personalities on both sides of the war,
only three remain alive—David
Lloyd George, Newton D. Bakerand Francisco Nitti. Only three
of the score of rulers who sat
on thrones or in presidential
chairs during the war are still
alive, and two of them, deposed
by their subjects, are alive in
solitary exile—Wilhelm II of
Germany and Ferdinand of Bulgaria. King Victor Emmanuel
of Italy is the only ruler of
vartime who is still alive and
still on a throne.

The toll was the heaviest among the generals who commanded the armies of millions of fighting men. Most of them were old in the service when the war started, and 20 years having passed since they won glory on the battlefields, those who have survived have abandoned active military caneers.

None of the five chief delegates who signed the Armistice is still alive—Foch, for France; Admiral Wester Wemyss, then Britain's First Sea Lord; Erzberger, secretary of state, General von Oberndorf for Germany. Erzberger was executed a few years later. France's General Weygand, Germany's naval Captain Von Geyer, and Britain's Captain Won Geyer, and Britain's Captain Marriott, who were aides-de-camp in attendance at the signing of the Armistice in Foch's dining-car in a clearing in the forest at Rethondes, are the only survivors of those who witnessed that historic ceremony.

Of the major personalities

House, Andre Tardieu, South Africa's two generals, Jans Smuts and Botha, Belgium's Max Hymans and Emil Vanderveld, Ignace Paderewski and Dr. Edward Benes: household?
