Pair of New Homes Open for Inspection



Two of the three modern five-room homes recently completed and opened for public inspection at 1542 and 1546 213th street (between Denker and Harvard, three blocks north of Carson street in the Los Angeles Shoring strip) are shown above. They were constructed by the Southern Finance Service of Pasadena which owns nearly 40 lots in the immediate neighborhood. The firm has announced plans for the early erection of 10 more homes in that district. The homes pictured sell for \$2,975 complete and can be financed thru FHA insured loans

whose monthly payments include principal, interest, taxes and insurance. They are regarded as exceptional buys for workingmen who desire to become home-owners and have something else than rent receipts to show for their housing expenditures.

T. B. Denny, representative of the building concern, is on the property daily to give information about the new homes, tract and financing. The district is within a few minutes walk or drive from the heart of the Torrance business center.

Ranks Thinned of War Great 19 Years After

PARIS, Nov. 11 (U.P.)—Nineteen years after the signing of the Armistice, in the forest of Compiègne, which brought the World War to a close, only four of the hundreds of great soldiers who commanded the armies in conflict, are still alive—John J. Pershing, Henry Pétain, Eric Ludendorff and Anton Denikin.

A survey of military statistics showed that the soldiers themselves fared better, and that out of the 22,000,000 men who went to war more than 11,000,000 veterans of that conflict are still alive.

Of the great political personalities on both sides of the war, only three remain alive—David Lloyd George, Newton D. Baker and Francisco Nitti. Only three of the score of rulers who sat on thrones or in presidential chairs during the war are still alive, and two of them, deposed by their subjects, are alive in solitary exile—Wilhelm II of Germany and Ferdinand of Bulgaria. King Victor Emmanuel of Italy is the only ruler of wartime who is still alive and still on a throne.

Few Treaty Signers Alive
The toll was the heaviest among the generals who commanded the armies of millions of fighting men. Most of them were old in the service when the war started, and 20 years having passed since they won glory on the battlefields, those who have survived have abandoned active military careers.

None of the five chief delegates who signed the Armistice is still alive—Foch, for France; Admiral Wester Weymss, then Britain's First Sea Lord; Erzberger, secretary of state, General von Winterfeldt and Count von Oberndorf for Germany. Erzberger was executed a few years later. France's General Weygand, Germany's naval Captain Vanselow and Staff Captain Von Geyor, and Britain's Captain Marriott, who were aides-de-camp in attendance at the signing of the Armistice in Foch's dining-car in a clearing in the forest at Rethondes, are the only survivors of those who witnessed that historic ceremony.

Of the major personalities who signed the consequent Versailles Treaty, only 11 are alive, including David Lloyd George, Col. Edward M. House, Andre Tardieu, South Africa's two generals, Jans Smuts and Botha, Belgium's Max Hymans and Emil Vanderveld, Ignace Paderewski and Dr. Edward Benes.

check the questionnaires. This, Biggers estimated, will take two weeks, and when compared with the card reports from these communities, will show the margin of error or misrepresentation in the voluntary reports.

Queries to be Answered
Fourteen questions are to be asked:

1. Name, address, and whether farmer or urban dweller?
2. Unemployed or partly unemployed, or working on government projects?
3. Are you able to work?
4. Age?
5. Color?
6. Sex?
7. Hours worked in the preceding week?
8. Number of weeks worked in the last 12 months?
9. Occupation?
10. In what industry is occupation followed?
11. Number of worker's in one's family, living in same household?
12. How many of these workers (Question 11) are unemployed, partially unemployed, or on government projects?
13. Number of dependents?
14. Total income, "cash and other," for the preceding week?

No one is required to answer the questions. The choice is left to the recipient. WPA Administrator Harry Hopkins has announced that his group would also conduct a census of unemployed concurrent with the census group's check. His announcement was a
