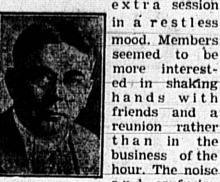

Congressman Colden at the Capitol

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17, (Special to The Herald)—The House of Representatives began the extra session



in a restless mood. Members seemed to be more interested in shaking hands with friends and a reunion rather than in the business of the hour. The noise and confusion were so great it was with difficulty that the roll was called. Speaker Bankhead wielded the gavel vigorously and was obliged to suspend the roll call and rap for order a number of times. Some of the Members preferred to stay at home until the regular session and were not very enthusiastic about an extra session that interfered with political and other affairs back home.

The President set forth four outstanding purposes of the extra session, first and foremost was the farm bill. He reminded Congress of its promise to pass farm legislation that would control production and stabilize prices. There is much difference of opinion as to this bill, and it is difficult to reconcile the various and conflicting interests of the farmers throughout the nation. Since it is first on the program, the House is merely marking time until this bill is reported out of the committee.

The second important piece of legislation is the Wage and Hour bill. This bill was already reported out of the committee in the last session and is now in a jam in the Rules Committee. Since a majority of the Rules Committee are opposed to the wage and hour legislation, there is still some question as to its action. Mrs. Mary Norton, Congresswoman from New Jersey, is chairman of the Labor Committee and has placed a discharge petition on the Speaker's desk. If this petition receives 218 signatures, the bill will automatically be brought to the floor of the House. This appears to be the probable course of this bill. There will be a lot of fighting over this measure, but the chances are that it will pull thru in some kind of shape.

The third part of the President's program is the reorganization of the executive departments. This is also a very controversial subject. Every department and bureau of the government gets the jitters
