### Hundreds Throng Church to See Confirmation

Hundreds of persons, unable to gain admittance to the jam-packed church on Cota avenue, stood in the bright sunshine outside last Sunday morning while Archbishop James J. Cantwell administered the Holy Sacraments of Confirmation to a class of 62 at the Catholic Church of the Nativity.  
The large class of confirmandi included 15 recent converts to the church, according to Rev. Father Joseph V. Fitzgerald. They followed a cross bearer and two acolytes in a procession from Father Fitzgerald's rectory. His Grace, the Archbishop, was attended by Monsignors George Donahue of Redondo's St. James church, Vincent Schiapparelli of Wilmington's Sts. Peter and Paul, and Joseph McGuiken, secretary to the Archbishop, and priests from all of the surrounding parishes.  
After the two-hour service, under brilliant in the little church by the ecclesiastical canopy of the church, Archbishop Cantwell received the visiting priests and members of the church at the rectory. According to Father Fitzgerald he was delighted to learn that a substantial building fund is being accumulated by members of the local parish for the construction of a larger and more attractive church.

### St. Andrews Forming Confirmation Class

A confirmation class which will be presented to the Bishop for the service of Confirmation about the middle of February is now being organized at St. Andrews Episcopal church.  
To date the prospects are good that the class will be larger than last year's class, according to the vicar, Rev. Thomas R. Marshall. Persons who are interested in entering the class should see Rev. Marshall at once. Instruction will begin after the first of the year.
