

Fall Victim Sends Greetings to Rescuers

A Christmas greeting card that held more than usual interest was received by B. J. Scott, Torrance electrician and sportsman, last Friday. It was from the man Scott, his father-in-law John Yessen and the latter's son, Ray, all of this city rescued last September and rushed to medical attention from the wilds of the King's River country.

"Your courage and successful

effort made it possible for me to enjoy a happy Christmas," wrote the Fresno county deputy sheriff who the local men found badly injured as result of a fall while breaking a colt. Scott and the Yessens packed the injured man out of the mountains to a hospital where he is now completing his recovery.
