TWELFTH DAY FETE DISHES STAR BEANS

In England during the reign of Alfred it was customary to celebrate Twelfth Day—Jan. 6, or 12 days after Christmas—with twelfth cake. A piece of the cake was then, when the family and friends assembled for the cutting, the person who was served the slice with the bean became the "King of the Bean" for that day and ruler of the revels.

This old custom makes a happy way of doing a little "after the holidays" entertaining and may be the center for lots of fun. Of course there must be plenty of food served besides the cake, and no doubt the main dish for such an evening affair ought to feature a pan of baked beans.

Canned baked beans are ideal for this purpose because they are full of flavor, require only heating to be ready to serve, and because they are especially good to eat. There are various styles to choose from as there are baked beans with tomato sauce, without tomato sauce, with pork and without pork.

After the decision has been made as to the particular kind to use there is still opportunity to add your own personality in an extra flavor touch. Some cooks like to add a little onion and extra mustard to the beans, while others like to add slices of canned frankfurters.

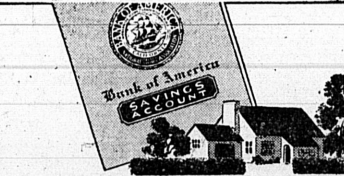
