"We have known and believed the love that God hath to us, God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him." These words of John are the Golden Text in the Lesson-Sermon on "Love" on Sunday in all branches of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts.
Among the Bible citations in the Lesson-Sermon are these verses from Matthew: "These twelve Jesus sent forth, and commanded them, saying, Go not into the way of the Gentiles, and into any city of the Samaritans enter ye not: But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And as ye go, preach, saying, The kingdom of heaven is at hand. Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out devils: freely ye have received, freely give."
A correlative passage from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy, states: "Our Master said to every follower: 'Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature! ... Heal the sick! Love thy neighbor as thyself!'"
This was the theology of Jesus which healed the sick and the sinning."

Bishop Stevens Here Sunday

The Rt. Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens D. D., Bishop of the Diocese of Los Angeles, will speak on the Oxford and Edinburgh Conferences at St. Andrew's Episcopal church, Sunday morning at 11 o'clock. Church historians have pronounced the discussions held and conclusions reached at both Oxford and Edinburgh as the most significant developments in Christendom since the Reformation.

The Oxford Conference considered the problem of the modern state and the church and the purpose of the Edinburgh Conference was to find a theological basis for church unity.

Bishop Stevens was an active delegate at both gatherings. Since his return to Los Angeles he has spoken throughout Southern California on his experiences of last summer. Citizens of Torrance as well as members of the Episcopal church are invited to hear him speak.

Help for Income Taxpayers

Local residents having difficulty in making out their 1937 income tax forms should remember to take their troubles with that document to the deputy income tax collector who will be at the Chamber of Commerce Feb. 9 and 10 from 10 a. m. to 4:30 p. m. Secretary L. J. Gilmeister is trying to extend this assistant's hours in order that those who work until 4:30 may be accommodated.

State Tax Aid
A representative of the State Income Tax division will be at the chamber Feb. 9 and 10 from 10 a. m. to 10 p. m., to assist local state income taxpayers without charge. The state law requires filing on or before April 15 if single, net income of \$1,000 or more; married (living with husband or wife), net income of \$2,500 or more, or a gross income of \$5,000 or more.
