
### May 'Stagger' Terms Of New Appointees

Assuring boys and girls of protection for their bicycles, Sheriff Biscalluz this week began enforcement of a new county ordinance requiring registration and licensing of 'bikes.' The 12 sheriff's substations throughout the county were furnished with blanks for registration of bicycles, and arrangements were made for licensing of the vehicles.'

With a license fee of only 25 cents, each bicycle will be registered and tagged by deputy sheriffs, insuring against thert and resale. The cost of the license and tag, the sheriff said, does not cover the expense of protecting the childrens' bicycles. He explained that during 1934, 4000 bicycles were stolen in Los Angeles city alone, and that after registration the thefts for op ped to 1,300 in 1937.
