Having burned considerable "midnight oil" to successfully gather in some high grades that will permit him to compete on the varsity track team this spring, Louis Zamperini, Torrance Olympic distance runner, will see his first 1938 competition tomorrow.

He will run in an interclass meet at U. S. C.'s Hayward Field, the event starting at 2:30 o'clock. Zamperini may compete in both the mile and two-mile event. Coach Dean Cromwell will be watching his performance with great interest because he has been quoted as saying that Louis is the "Trojans' best potential track star this year."

On Feb. 19 the Torrance marathoner will run in the Occidental handicap at the Eagle Rock institution and on March 5 he will be seen in the Long Beach relays.

the FHA in Los Angeles, states: "We have not been able to make loans to many sections because there are not proper zoning restrictions. We have been working on this zoning problem with some of the outlying city councils because it is a problem which the municipalities themselves must straighten out."

At the present time the Torrance city council is working out a new city-wide zoning ordinance and the second hearing on this measure, which, when adopted should assure many property owners of FHA approval for building loans, is to be held in the near future.

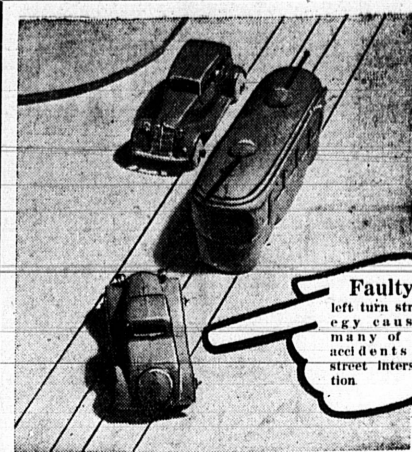
Aids Group Housing
The FHA has promulgated rules intended to stimulate construction of multi-family and group housing projects which are badly needed here to provide accommodations for locally-employed workers.

One section of the new legislation is designed to promote building of large-scale projects covered by mortgages up to \$5,000,000. Another is to encourage building of smaller developments covered by mortgages from \$16,000 to \$200,000. The new FHA regulations provide for partial Federal insurance of mortgages not only on multi-family structures, but also on developments consisting of single-family houses.

Releases Allowed
Under these regulations, officials said, it will be possible for developers to obtain blanket mortgage financing, including funds advanced for construction, on groups of single-family houses and then sell them on long-term payment plans or rent them.

The rules permit partial releases from the blanket mortgage as separate properties are sold.

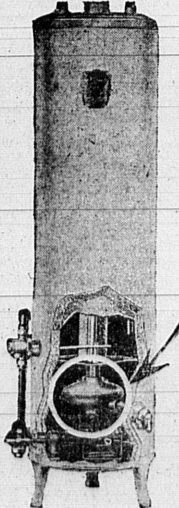
