### Delinquent Property Being Debt-Cleared, Co. Auditor Says

More than 3,600 parcels of land in Los Angeles county on which taxes were allowed to go delinquent in 1936 and prior years, now have been returned to the current tax rolls by payment in full or on the 10-payment plan, County Auditor H. A. Payne said today. "All the parcels for 1936 and prior have been inspected," Payne said, "and approximately 75 percent of the 4,950 parcels have been returned to the tax rolls by payment of taxes in full, or by the 10-payment plan. "About 50 percent of the 1937 parcels have been inspected and a large number of the owners already have paid in full or assumed installment payments.
