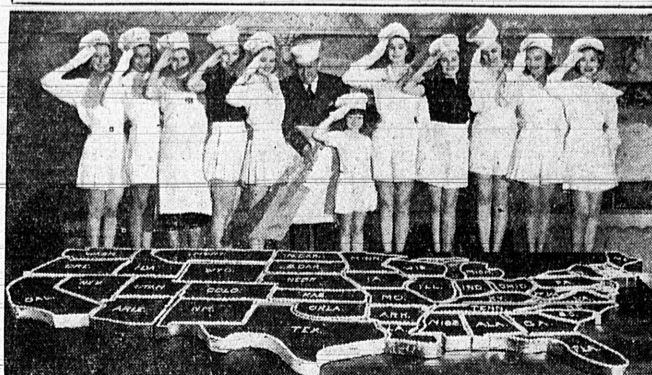
26 HONOR STUDENTS

Lakeside Oil company is pulling casing next to Grubbs' No. 3 and casing is being set on Doyle Petroleum's Al Bond No. 1 at 230th and Narbonne. Doyle's No. 1 is drilling ahead at 3,800 feet on 229th. Elyod Oil company's Torrance No. 1 is whipstock cemented at 980 feet near the No. 1.
