Around Hollywood Film Lots

HOLLYWOOD (U.P.)—Motion picture fans, watching the film stars pass into the theatre on preview nights in Hollywood, regard the affair as one of gaiety, a time when the actors enjoy themselves—but they are wrong.

Preview night, to the conscientious film actor, is a time of worry, tenseness. There is no fun in it, especially if the audience does not like the picture. Many a star has quietly crept out of the theatre before the picture was finished to avoid

overhearing remarks about how bad it was.

The preview is the final checkup of the picture, with audience reactions. From the comment cards, distributed to regular patrons at the theatre, the studio ascertains whether any changes or retakes are to be made before the film is released.

The star, however, is not the only one worried about the fate of the picture. Also present at the preview are the producer, the director, the film editor, the musical director, the sound engineer and supporting players.

These worried filmies spend most of their time at the preview trying to catch the reaction of the audience. Did the laughs come at the right time, what happened to the sure-fire gags, and other questions are asked and answered mentally.

Joan Crawford usually is a nervous wreck after a preview from tension and concentrated observing of audience and picture. Clark Gable sits in a rear seat and then escapes from the theatre by a side door. Robert Taylor analyzes every phase of his performance.

Myrna Loy is a handkerchief twister at previews, while Wallace Berry chews gum furiously. The only one who doesn't worry is Greta Garbo. She doesn't go to previews.

After the preview usually a hurried conference is held by producer, director, film editor and sound engineer. Frequently the film editor rushes the film back to the studio that night for editing changes while the reactions still are fresh in his mind.

After that it is up to the box office to prove whether the picture was or was not what the public wanted.

Mental Health Centers Planned

Plans for construction of two mental health centers through which every mental case in California would be cleared have been announced by State Director of Institutions Harry Lutgens. They will be established in the San Francisco and Los Angeles areas and each would cost \$1,500,000, he reported.

The \$3,000,000 fund for their construction was provided by the McMurtry bill passed by the 1937 legislature. The construction plans already have been approved by Governor Merriam.
