Now I like dogs, and I appreciate the feeling that everyone has for his pet. But it seems to me that the sympathies of the Tail-Waggers Foundation might be reserved for future use. Let the authorities have their day and perhaps rabies can be cleaned up. An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure says the old saw. But in this case prevention is worth infinitely more, for there is no cure for rabies.

HEALTH, SIGHT BENEFITED BY PROPER SURROUNDINGS

South Diagonal Highway Should be 'Free-Way'

Any consideration given to a proposed diagonal highway between Redondo Beach and Riverside county should be on the basis of a free-way thoroughfare, County Road Commissioner George Jones said this week in replying to a resolution of the Redondo Beach city council. It would connect with an existing route in Riverside county.

All intersections should be eliminated, and such a proposal, said to have been advanced originally by Riverside promoters, would be expensive and would not be justified unless it is to be more than "just another road," Jones said.

Plan for Future
A diagonal connection with Sepulveda boulevard at some point north of Hermosa Beach would be a desirable addition to the project to allow traffic to by-pass the congested area in Redondo and Hermosa Beach.

"Magnitude of the proposed project indicates extensive investigation and design studies would be necessary, but it is entirely probable that at the time such a project could be planned, the right-of-way obtained and the cost of construction financed, there will be ample traffic available for it," the county road commissioner added.

Hope to Stimulate Property Sales by Notifying Realtors

Realty boards are to be notified henceforth whenever the board of supervisors disposes of county-owned property, under a new policy suggested by Supervisor H. C. Legg.

The plan was suggested in order to stimulate bidding on property sales, when only one bid was received recently by the board on a parcel of improved property sold in Santa Monica.

By notifying the realty board in the area where the property is located, the board hopes to stimulate bidding when the auction is held by the supervisors.

New Materials For Modernizing Baths

Many of the new materials on the market for modernizing bathrooms may be adapted to the out-moded bathroom of 10 years ago.

A wide variety of tile and composition is available, all waterproof, which makes ideal side walls and flooring and may be obtained in a number of colors. Fixtures have been improved and simplified, and bathtub designs have been changed and improved.

An old bathroom may be completely transformed by a rearrangement of fixtures and addition of new wall and floor material. Projects of this type may be financed under the Property Improvement Credit Plan of the F.H.A.

Exterior Lighting May be Indirect

The outside of the house may be illuminated successfully with indirect lighting.

Illuminated panels at the side of a doorway, or directly over it, will display the house number advantageously and light the path and the steps. A light so situated that it illuminates the walk between house and garage is particularly useful.

Houses may be rewired thru funds obtained from a bank of other private financial institution insured under the Property Improvement Credit Plan of the F.H.A.
