## Drainage District Tax Estimated

A new county-wide levy of 3½ cents will be required next year to raise funds for operation of the dozen odd county drainage improvement districts transferred to the flood control district by the board of supervisors, and to retire bonds. This is the estimate compiled by Chief Engineer C. H. Howell of the flood control district for the supervisors.

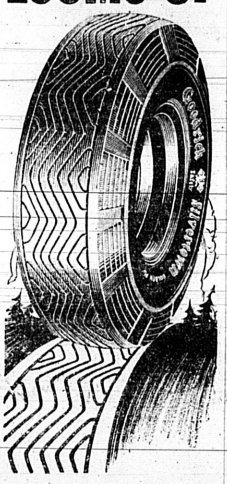
The 3½-cent estimate is entirely separate from the flood control district levy, which will have to be placed at its maximum of 20 cents next year, on the basis of the budget submitted.

Formerly the cost of operating these drainage systems and retirement of bonds was borne by the district served by the system. By transferring the districts to the flood control district the cost is borne by all taxpayers in the flood control district, which takes in all of the county except Antelope Valley.

## O'Connor Takes Co. Counsel Job

John H. O'Connor, member of the county counsel's office since 1921, this week was sworn in as county counsel and \$10,000-a-year legal advisor to the county government.

Number one on the eligible list created by the civil service commission after a special written and oral examination, O'Connor was the unanimous choice of the board of supervisors for the post left vacant by the resignation of County Counsel Everett W. Mattoon two months ago.

The new county counsel was born ~~1897~~ 1895 at Downey 55 years ago and his father, Patrick O'Connor still resides on the ranch. Educated at St. Vincent's, now Loyola, O'Connor graduated from the University of California law school in 1919. After discharge from the army in 1919, he entered the office of the then city attorney of Los Angeles, Charles Burnell, now Superior Court Judge. Two years later he became a deputy county counsel under A. J. Hill and has been in the office since that time. He is married, has a son one year old and now resides in Glendale.

pipe is given as the cause. C. M. O. is also deepening its No. 8 on Sepulveda and the Patton-Conway fee well on 233rd between Narbonne and Pennsylvania is towering.

Tuesday Standard Oil's Martin No. 1 was drilled in with oil for one of the best completions in recent weeks. Pumping production is estimated at nearly 300 barrels of 27 gravity cutting four percent and three percent mud from 4,905 feet.

Grubbs and Main are drilling the Lyman No. 1 on 230th and have cased both 6½ and 8-inch pipe. Ellexco Oil has a rig built for its Allen No. K-1. Neal H. Anderson is agent for this company. Three-in-One Oil is completing a rig for a new well located approximately 600 feet northeast of 229th and Pennsylvania.

**Other New Derriks**

Hansco Oil is rigging up over the old Julian Petroleum Gladys No. 1, located at 229th and Pennsylvania. Livermore and Markley's No. 1, located at the southeast corner of 231st and Pennsylvania has been rigged to deepen an old hole. Near 231st and Pennsylvania Walt Hughes will start a deep sand project in Hughes No. 2. Peters Royalty is preparing to start its second well at 229th and Pennsylvania and Gypsy Oil will deepen the old Getty No. 16 northeast of 229th and Pennsylvania.

B. W. Forgy is reconditioning the old Richfield Thomas No. 2 on Sepulveda between Narbonne and Pennsylvania. Superior Oil is putting up a steel derrick at 231 Sepulveda and other new derriks are being erected by Neal Anderson at 2410 231st, and Charles W. Camp at 2358 231st.

**ORDINANCE NO. 303**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE REGULATING PLUMBING AND REPEALING THAT PORTION OF PARAGRAPH 70 OF SECTION 12 OF ORDINANCE NO. 235 WHICH REFERS TO PLUMBING CONTRACTORS, ALSO THAT PORTION OF SECTION 3 OF ORDINANCE NO. 259 WHICH REFERS TO JOURNEYMEN PLUMBERS, AND READS "OR A BONA FIDE RESIDENT OWNER OF A HOME IN WHICH PLUMBING IS BEING OR TO BE DONE," AND ALSO REPEALING SECTION 5 OF ORDINANCE NO. 259.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE City Council of the City of Torrance as follows:

Section 1. Plumbing Contractors' License Fee shall be Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars per year, payable in advance. Said License shall expire one (1) year from date of issuance.

Section 2. Each Plumbing Contractor shall be or have in his employ a Master Plumber. A Master Plumber is hereby defined as any plumber who has in his possession a Master Plumber's card issued by some Municipal Corporation or the County of Los Angeles identifying him, or one who can prove to the satisfaction of the Plumbing Inspector that he is qualified to act as a Master Plumber. The Plumbing Inspector, after being satisfied that the applicant is so qualified, shall issue a Master Plumber's card.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to install or permit the installation of any plumbing without first obtaining the proper license and/or permit to do such work, except in the case of a home owner actually owning and residing or planning to reside in the building for which the permit is required, in which case said home owner shall apply to the City Plumbing Inspector for a permit to install said plumbing. When said owner applies for a permit it will be necessary for him to satisfy the plumbing inspector that he is capable of performing said plumbing work and shall sign a statement declaring that he personally will install said plumbing work.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of the foregoing ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper printed, published and circulated in the City of Torrance and hereby designated for that purpose, and thereupon and thereafter this ordinance shall be in full force and effect.
