

## MRS. SHANK SUMMONED AT LOMITA

In failing health for the past three years, Mrs. Mary Shank, wife of David C. Shank, well-known Lomita store owner and pastor of the Missionary Church of Christ of that community, passed away suddenly Tuesday morning at the family home, 24063 Woodward street. She was 58 years of age.

Mrs. Shank had assisted her husband in the store for many years and her death came as a distinct shock to the community which respected her sterling character and friendly interest in all affairs. She lived in California 21 years, eight of them in Lomita.

The funeral was held this afternoon at Calvary Evangelical church with Rev. John A. Louby of Van Nuys assisting the resident pastor, Rev. Harold Adams, in the service. A. M. Gamby Mortuary was in charge of arrangements. The body will be sent to Pandora, Ohio, for interment. It was near that city that Mrs. Shank was born July 6, 1879. In addition to her devoted husband, Mrs. Shank is survived by a son, Oliver J., of Van Nuys; two daughters, Mrs. Kenneth Stucky, also of Van Nuys, and Mrs. H. P. Osborne of Lomita; a step-daughter, Mrs. L. R. Grismore of Pandora, and 10 grandchildren.

## Hix, San Pedro in Congress Race

Supported by a large number of friends throughout the Harbor Harbor district, Clifton A. Hix, San Pedro attorney and past commander of San Pedro Post No. 65 of the American Legion, is well on his campaign this week for election as Congressman from the 17th Congressional district on the Republican ticket.

Hix is 38 years of age, born and raised on a Missouri farm and served in the Army during the World War. He received his law degree at the University of Colorado in 1925 and has been a San Pedro resident for the past 11 years. He is married and has two children. His veteran associations include service as past commander of the Los Angeles County Council and being a past national executive committee member of the American Legion.

His friends assert he has "always been friendly to labor and the laboring man, is interested in harbor development and general improvement for the 17th Congressional district and that he is in favor of sufficient armament for adequate national defense, but is opposed to armament for purposes of offense." It is Hix's desire, they assert, to represent "all the people rather than to represent some particular group or faction to the exclusion of others."
