SOUTH BY THUNDERBIRD

by Hudson Strode

"When the Indians of South America first saw an airplane, they called it 'the thunder bird' and pursued it to find its eggs."

Traveling by air gave Hudson Strode an initial perspective and afforded a longer visit-on-hand. His books on Bermuda and Cuba are still unexcelled and he has written in this volume a comprehensive story of the South American republics; their political economy; agriculture and industrial promise and their distinctive character. Fact and impression are always well balanced in his reporting and wherever he went he took his good nature with him, thereby adding to the book the promise which he feels that the continents may cooperate for peace and prosperity of the Western Hemisphere.

THE MOON IS MAKING BY

Stearns-Jameson

"You know when they say the moon is making, queer people behave more queerly." Most of the action centers about the Wikker family, full of "remendous courage, living in the little

"The author states flatly that only the liberal who can tolerate every extreme without adopting any extreme is the true defender of democratic freedom. This book is distinguished from almost all other books directed toward this purpose by combining, and with temperance. Its temperance consists not merely in rejection of both of the familiar extremes Fascism and Communism, but in its recognition of the pitfalls that beset even the middle course which the author advocates.

"Liberism, which is the core of American life is coming back." We do not have to choose either Fascism or Communism, says Stearns-Jameson, and here are many who say the same thing.

I SPEAK FOR THE CHINESE by Carl Crow: The author whose delightful "400 Million Customers" has entertained so many readers has turned his attention to the Sino Japanese conflict, words familiar to most of us but understood by few. In his preface, Crow states that "Japan's long policy of infringement upon China is not well known. She has always timed her moves when the eyes of the world were turned elsewhere. Some incidents have been remembered, some forgotten, but they all fit together in logical sequence and tell one consistent story of militant aggression which has hesitated at nothing.

This is the story which this little volume tells very briefly. Its 82 pages are well worth the reading for a clear, concise statement in which all historical facts have been authenticated from many sources.
