

Garbage Contract Renewal Under Fire Here

Whether or not the city council will call for bids on the garbage removal contract for the coming year was still as much of a mystery today as it was a week ago, altho a considerable portion of Tuesday night's session was devoted to that question.

The discussion provoked one verbal protest. F. D. Foley, 3401 Spencer street in the Dominguez tract, made that when he declared that the contract should not be renewed until everyone interested has an opportunity of bidding for the garbage work.

Councilman Jack Murray also demanded to know why the present holder of the contract, Luther Andrews, who has had the job for several years, should not go into open market and bid for the work in competition with others who may want it. He said he knew of four other men who wanted a chance to bid on it.

Several letters from local residents have been received about the garbage contract by City Clerk A. H. Bartlett, who said that he has had no communication as yet from Andrews whether or not he wants to renew it. No action was taken by the council on the subject but it will probably be considered at the next session.

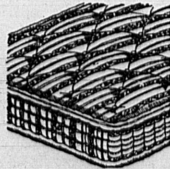
