While central hyadquarters for the service are maintained in Los Angeles, arrangements have been completed by Dr. Rogers so that member hospitals may operate as branches of the main office, supplying all necessary information and registration forms required by the State In-surance Commissioner under whose jurisdiction the group operate. All member hospitals, it was also pointed out, are ap-proved by the State Board of Health.

Health Health. "The response of both em-ployers and employees to the group plan of hospitalization is most gratifying," asserts Dr. Rogers. "Hospitals alone can guarantee hospital service and theirs is the ultimate re-sponsibility. There should be d theirs is the ultimate re-onsibility. There should be middle-man between the spital itself and the person eding its services, and this oup plan enables the hospitals themselves to make it possible for working people to provide in advance for liospossible for working people to provide in advance for **B**os-pital care and pay for it as a regular item in the family idget."




