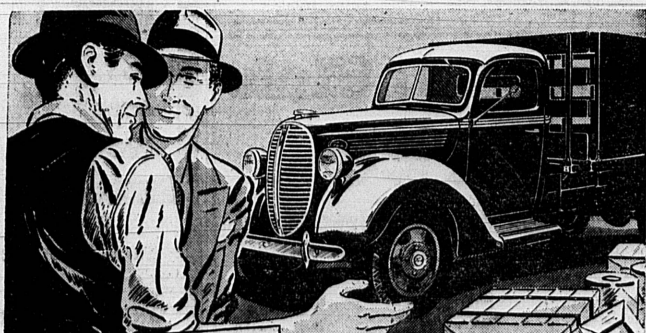

Though Japanese air raiders mercilessly bomb Canton and other cities over the protests of world democracies, Japan will not win its war in China, says the Rt. Rev. Logan Root, Episcopal bishop in Hankow for 34 years, shown above as he arrived on the West Coast with his daughter, Frances. En route home to Arkansas, Bishop Root said "the spirit of China is the spirit of revolutionary Christianity... the Chinese will prove that arms are not necessarily supreme."
