Radio Audience Survey Shows 25% Coverage of Total Receiving Sets

—C.N.P.A., Inc. Service—
Only 25 percent of all radio receiving sets are in operation at any given time, and even at peak periods listener reception never rises above 50 percent of the number of radios in a given area, a survey of the Los Angeles radio audience revealed recently.
Manufacturers, industrialists, and advertising men were quick to attach paramount importance to the survey, made in an area which, according to radio executives, is the only one in the world where the audience reaction and number of listeners is automatically recorded.
The survey system used in the Los Angeles area involves 29,000 direct telephone interviews concentrated in the market for a period of one week each month. Calls are put thru every 15 minutes for 13 hours each day, the cost of the survey being borne by individual radio stations and national networks.
Saturday Poorest Day
To secure 29,000 actual interviews, the surveyors found it necessary to make 68,000 telephone calls. Starting at 8:15 a. m. and ending at 10 p. m., the survey shows the total number of listeners for the day, the number of listeners to any station during a definite period, and the number of listeners for each 15 minute period over the entire area.
When compared to the number of receiving sets in the section, the survey revealed that the average of sets in operation during the entire week was but 25 percent of the total. In a typical week, those conducting the study of the market found that peak reception came at 9 p. m. Sunday, when approximately 50 percent of all receiving sets were turned on. The average for the day, however, was given as but 22 percent of the total.
Poorest day for listeners to programs was given as Saturday, when a high of 30 percent was recorded at 8 p. m. with the average being only 15 percent.

Double Penalty Not Required of Employers

California employers failing to make returns on 1936 contributions to the unemployment trust fund were informed this week by Carl L. Hyde, executive officer of the state department of unemployment, they will not be forced to make double contributions. Deadline for the return was April 1, 1937.
Hyde recently received word from Washington that the federal Revenue Act of 1933 contained such a provision. Interest penalties will be charged employers failing to make the contribution, but it will be much less than the double penalty originally enforced.
