Vets' Democratic Unit Picnic Has 900 Attending

Nine hundred veterans and their families and friends attended the picnic given by the Veterans' Democratic Association of the 17th Congressional District at Fred Harlow's Lake Club last Sunday afternoon. Following a soft ball game between the Girls' Spec. Det. team of Wilmington and the Veterans' team, resulting in a victory for the plucky girls, endorsed candidates of the organization were introduced.

Dr. Charles W. McQuarrie, Democratic candidate for Congress in the 17th District, was the principal speaker. Cecil R. King, assemblyman representing the 67th district, Judge Frank R. Carroll, candidate for re-election as justice of the peace, and representatives of William G. Bonelli, seeking return as member of the State Board of Equalization from this district; Harry B. Riley, state controller, and candidates seeking office in adjoining assembly districts were introduced. Supervisor Lela M. Ford, contender for the nomination for Congress in the 16th District, comprising the beach communities to the west, also outlined his platform.

Introducing Dr. McQuarrie and the other candidates was Thomas A. Glenn, commander of Los Angeles Harbor Chapter of the Disabled American Veterans, who acted as master of ceremonies. Although the privileges of the platform were extended other candidates only the officially endorsed congressional and assembly candidates were allowed to speak.
