George Armistead is shown above in the 920-horsepower plane "Q. E. D." which he will pilot in the annual Bendix transcontinental airplane race from Los Angeles on Sept. 3. Seeking a share of \$30,000 prize money, Armistead will fly the reconstructed ship above 15,000-foot altitudes, and breathe with an oxygen mask. The plane is similar to the ill-famed "G-B's," which have carried at least three pilots to death.
