#### Deer Season to Close Sept. 15 In Some Areas

With deer hunting in the Coastal counties closing Sept. 15, hunters in other sections of California today prepared for the opening of other districts from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15, inclusive.

The season is ending for Districts 2, 2½, 3, and 3½, which comprises the coastal counties from the coast range to the ocean, roughly from Mendocino county to Ventura.

Hunters shot down 25,000 deer last year, and more deer tags have been sold this year than the 130,000 issued in 1937. The limit is two deer per season, except in districts 1½ and 4½, where only one is permitted.
