## GROUND-BREAKING RITES FOR NEW CHURCH SUNDAY

Following a conference Tuesday morning with Archbishop John J. Cantwell, Father Joseph V. Fitzgerald announced that the plans for the ground-breaking ceremonies for the new \$25,000 Catholic Church of the Nativity would be an all-day affair here next Sunday, Sept. 11. He said the Archbishop had appointed Monsignor George Donahue of Redondo Beach to be his official representative at the ceremonies.

Father Fitzgerald will officiate at the 8 and 10 o'clock Masses next Sunday when Holy Communion will be served in thanksgiving for the new church that is to be erected at the corner of Engracia and Manuel avenues. At 12 o'clock a baby-beef dinner will be served at the Civic Auditorium. Tickets for the dinner, which will continue to 3 o'clock and be resumed after the ground-breaking rites, are 50 cents for adults and 30 for children. They may be obtained at the entrance to the Auditorium.

At 3 o'clock the program at the site of the new church will start. There will be addresses by Monsignor Donahue, Superior Judge Thomas P. White, Mayor Tolson and other city officials and a number of neighboring priests. The ceremonies will be concluded with the Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. At 4:30 the dinner in the Auditorium will be resumed and continue until 6 o'clock.

Rev. Fitzgerald cordially invites all residents of Torrance and vicinity to the dinner and the ground-breaking. The new church, designed by Kauzor Brothers, will be constructed by the Howard Pacific company. The edifice is expected to be completed in ample time for formal dedication on Christmas Day.
