When the rejuvenated Torrance Tartars sweep south into the pampas of Lomita tomorrow afternoon they will have five fingers clutching Lady Luck's good right hand to help them toward their second victory over Narbonne's Gauchos. That handful of pro-Torrance dope is composed of:

(1) The game will be the 13th between the two schools and inasmuch as Torrance has borne the tough breaks since 1926 the conflict should prove unlucky for Lomita;

(2) Last week's victory over the Banning Pilots gave the Tartars some confidence in their own powers;

(3) Because Narbonne and Banning played a scoreless tie two weeks ago, the "paper edge" of Friday's game goes to Torrance;

(4) Toughened by league games with Gardena and Banning, the Tartars have had more experience than the Lomita squad whose game with San Pedro last Friday was their first, and

(5) Torrance has a heavier team. The Tartar line averages 185 as compared to the Gauchos' 162, while the local team's backfield averages 180 as against the Lomita eleven's 152 pounds.

And, if the thrill of another Torrance-Narbonne game is not enough to send all grid fans in this city trekking south to Lomita in time for the kick-off at 2:30 o'clock tomorrow, there's another feature to the inter-community classic: It will be a junior edition of the U.S.C.-U.C.L.A. "civil war."

Teams in Good Shape
Coach Robert Barr, mentor of the Tartars, is an alumnus of U.C.L.A., while Bill Sloan's alma mater is the Trojan institution. Each will produce everything they learned from Messrs. Bill Spaulding and Howard Jones to help their first high school charges.

There will be extra bleachers at Griffin field in Lomita to accommodate up to 5,000 fans. Both teams are reported in excellent condition for the annual combat. Narbonne's Green and Gold supporters will be on hand en masse hoping to see the Gauchos make it two straight victories this season and the 10th over the Torrance Tartars.

The other Marine league game of the week-end is the Gardena-San Pedro encounter at Gardena. Banning is playing a practice game with South Gate.

Torrance Takes Banning 7-0 for First Grid Victory in Two Years

When plunging Marvin Goetsch skirted the Banning Pilot line for 20 yards to the invaders' two-yard marker and Akige Shimatsu dived over center for the touchdown early in the third quarter of the Torrance-Banning game last Friday afternoon, a long, long two-year period between grid victories for the local school came to an end. Kenneth Perkin's talented toe booted the extra point and the first Tartar win since Torrance beat El Segundo 18 to 7 on Nov. 6, 1936, was in the bag.

Banning threatened to tie that score with a feverish passing attack but this failed when Torrance recovered the ball on its own 20 and the gun barked for the last time. More than 2,500 fans swept on the field and the victory celebration added another festive note to the Factory Frolic.

Torrance was on the defensive most of the game but managed to out-gain the Pilots in scrimmage. Banning showed superior skill in the air, completing 15 out of 28 passes. The visitors advanced with six straight complete passes before missing one and made eight out of nine heaves good in the first half.

Steady Plugging Effective
Honors for the outstanding Torrance player of the game must be divided between speedy Shimatsu, hard-plunging Goetsch and Jim Snyder, whose work on the line was something to claim All-Marine honors. For Banning, in addition to an excellent forward wall, Ikeguchi and Mele starred in the backfield.

Perhaps the notable feature of the afternoon was the steady fight displayed by the Tartars. While they did not break into any brilliant rallies (but had several occasions to do so), nevertheless they did not let down at any time. This gave but few thrills to the game but to those who have bemoaned the lack of spirit in the past two Torrance teams the plugging of the 1938 varsity was decidedly encouraging.

Capt. Ray Richhart at center played a splendid game and in the third quarter, after intercepting a pass, appeared off to the promised land of touchdowns when he was forced out of bounds on his 27-yard line after a gain of about 18 yards. The Grubb brothers, Charles and Gerald, displayed their usual good form in the line. Henry Pukoff, due to a bad ankle, was forced to take things easy and this put down on the Tartars' chances to gain yardage.

Banning's team showed commendable power but could not break down a fine Torrance defense on thrusts that pierced deep into the Tartars' territory and then bogged down. The opening in-cups were:
