NORTH, SOUTH ARTERY HELD TOO COSTLY

Construction of a new north-south traffic artery to relieve congestion on Alameda boulevard, as proposed by the Harbor District Chambers of Commerce, would be a costly project, the board of supervisors was advised this week by George Jones, county road commissioner.

The proposed artery would connect the easterly end of Adams street with Century boulevard, running parallel to and approximately a block to the east of Alameda street. Alameda street is a main artery between Los Angeles and the harbor district, and traversed by heavy automobile as well as truck traffic.

Heavy cost of acquiring right-of-way would necessitate it being acquired over a period of years, Jones advised. No surveys for the proposed relief artery have been made either by the county or by the city of Los Angeles. About half of the proposed route lies within the Los Angeles city limits.

Week's Building Permits Total \$92,500 Here

\$12,200 for pipeline suspension supports, on Sept. 15, and \$2,500 for a sand filter and salt tower, building permit granted Sept. 26.

The new Safeway store market started Monday. This will be a most attractive addition to the Sartori-El Prado business district. Designed in the modern functional style with glass brick inserts, it will be 60 feet wide on Sartori and extend 110 feet along El Prado. A marquis extending five feet over the sidewalk will extend along Sartori and part way up El Prado.

There will be a 30-foot loading and entrance space at the rear and the two lots immediately southwest of the alley will be asphalt paved for a parking area. A 21-foot driveway on El Prado will lead into this space and the parking area will be 60 by 155 feet.

Other Permits Listed
The new market is expected to be ready for occupancy in about two months and it will include many new departments, according to reports received from Safeway Stores' headquarters in Los Angeles.

Other building permits issued during the past week here were: for new wooden oil derricks—Plymouth Oil Company at 2054 236th, \$5,000; A. & T. Oil company, 2039 237th, \$5,000; Union Construction company, 2026 238th, \$5,000, and steel derricks to be erected for the Standard Oil company's Marble 2-10 on the Marble lease at the end of 236th, \$5,000, and for Marble 2-11 \$5,000.

Dillinger for a one-room addition to a house at 2468 Torrance boulevard, \$500; William Nye of Redondo Beach, for a five-room frame stucco residence at 1328 Acacia, \$3,600, and the Southern California Edison company for an addition to a house at 17580 Arlington avenue, \$500.

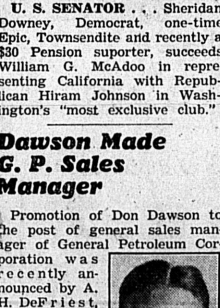
