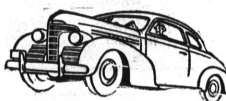

## Figueroa Paving Contract Let by State Dept.

On their low bid of \$85,584, the Griffith company was awarded the contract Tuesday by the state department of public works for the grading and surfacing of the last 1.9 miles of Figueroa street between Lomita boulevard and Wilmington-San Pedro road. Completion of this final project will open Figueroa street clear through from the west basin to Los Angeles, a second link between 100th street and Lomita boulevard having been completed two weeks ago. Both parts of the completion of the new road to the harbor have been provided through a 45 percent FWA grant, the state paying the balance of the cost.
