

# Marine Cage Race Ending Friday

## San Pedro Due to Break Tangle and Win Title

When San Pedro's varsity upset the Banning Pilots, 40 to 32, Tuesday afternoon the eleventh-hour race for the Marine League basketball championship was tossed into a three-way tie. The final games tomorrow afternoon will determine whether El Segundo or San Pedro wins the co-championship with Banning.

El Segundo's easy win over the Torrance Tartars 37 to 27 on the Oilers' floor dropped the local five to fourth place in the Marine race. Banning should take Narbonne, which has not won a game all season, without difficulty tomorrow and thus walk off with the league title.

In the Class B division, San Pedro's undefeated lightweights have already won the honors with El Segundo second. Torrance Bees, who play Gardena tomorrow in the closing game, have had but one victory to date, and are down in last place.

### PIRATES UPSET PILOTS

Vinko Matulich, high scorer for San Pedro, played inspired ball Tuesday to account for 18 of the Pirates' 42 points as against Banning's 30. Jack Tweedie, Banning star, was held to only five digits. The Pirates Bees swamped the Banning lights 42 to 28 to grab the pennant.

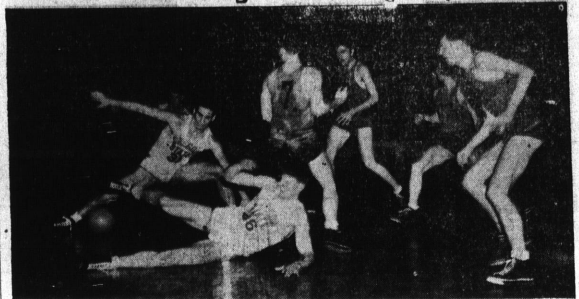
