


BUILDING A CITY OF THE FUTURE

Chronic Drunks Face Enforced Cure Under Law

A bill which would permit judges in any court in the county to sentence habitual drunkards to an inebriate home for cure and rehabilitation is winning wide support from social agencies, law enforcement officers and civic leaders in many communities, according to Municipal Judge Leo Freund of Los Angeles, father of the measure.

"During a survey made a year ago it was revealed that 75 percent of persons cited into the county's various misdemeanor courts—outside of traffic—were charged with drunkenness or 'runk driving,'" declared Judge Freund.

"And more than one-third of these had been arrested five or more times, and thus might be classed as habitual offenders. There were even some who had been arrested as many as 150 times for drunkenness."

Modern Treatment

"These individuals are not 'clumsy,' nor can they be classified as criminals, they are weak human beings. If they had diphtheria, measles or smallpox, we would rush them to the hospital and cure them."

"There was a time when people who were insane were thrown in jail. Today we consider that barbaric. Chronic inebriates, however, who can no more help their condition than can those we place in insane asylums, are arrested, turned loose after a few days in jail, picked up again and so on, over and over."

According to figures cited recently by the chief of police of Los Angeles, more than one-third of a recent year's police department budget was spent in arresting and maintaining drunks.

Sun As Source Of Cosmic Rays Seems Unlikely

SWARTHMORE, Pa. (U.P.)—A theory of some scientists that cosmic rays are given off by the sun has been disputed by Dr. W. P. G. Swann, director of the Franklin Institute's Bartol Research Foundation.

The scientist's statement was based upon a series of balloon flight experiments conducted for the foundation by Dr. Thomas H. Johnson.

Six balloons carrying recording instruments and a miniature transmitter were sent up to an altitude of 78,000 feet in day and night experiments.

Recordings of cosmic rays showed their intensity to be alike in night and day. Dr. Swann said, indicating that they emanate from some source outside the solar system, possibly from some distant flaming stars.


