Assessors Take Field March 6

The 1939 assessment season is officially on, according to County Assessor John R. Quinn, with a school of instruction for deputy assessors scheduled to run all this week. Then next Monday, March 6, the 440 deputies will take the field actively, to work continuously until this year's assessment rolls are completed.

"I am instructing my deputies that one of the prime requisites of their work is to maintain absolute courtesy with the public," Quinn said. "Their school of instruction will have given them a thorough grounding in the technical requirements of their assessment work."

Forest Reserves Funds Divided

California counties containing U. S. forest reserves received \$162,843 from collections made by the federal government in national forests during the last fiscal year, State Controller Harry B. Riley revealed this week.

The apportionment, 25 percent of total collections, is made to the counties and divided equally between schools and highways. The current grant, Riley said, is about 14.5 percent less than was paid during the preceding year.

Los Angeles county received \$9,520.51 as its share of the apportionment.
