COUNTY BANS ADVANCE OF GAS TAXES

None of the county's 44 cities will be permitted to draw upon the county for advances on their share of gas tax monies hereafter, according to a resolution adopted by the board of supervisors Tuesday.

Many cities have made a practice of filing requests for their share of the money allotted by the state immediately after the beginning of the fiscal year and the board usually has granted such requests, especially when such pleas are backed by the assertion that the funds are needed for street repair work for the rainy season sets in.

Following this practice is one reason that the county has been forced to register some \$300,000 in warrants, drawing interest at the rate of five percent a year, the supervisors declared. These warrants are costing the county taxpayers about \$1,000 a month in interest charges, because of funds granted the cities.
