Debt Decreases

A steady decrease in the bonded indebtedness of Los Angeles county during the past 10 years, sar compared with an increase for governmental bodies generally, was revealed by County Auio 10 J. M. Lowery this week. The decrease was regarded as favorate and the county has prevented as a county office building and court house.

The bonded indebtedness of all governmental agencies in the county has increased from \$356,-338,667.16 to \$612,16,023.51 in the past decade while the bonded debt of the county government alone has dropped from \$7,000,000 to \$4,280,000.

Of the total bonded debt in the county, 49.02 percent is against municipalities, 33.25 per cent against special districts, 17.04 percent against shool districts and only .60 of one percent against the county itself. 
