

RETURN OF INDIGENTS SAVES COUNTY MILLIONS, REPORT

It has cost Los Angeles taxpayers \$785,398 to return 15,540 indigent transients and aliens back to their place of origin by train alone in the last 13 years, according to Roger Jessup, chairman of the board of supervisors. The savings effected in reduced charities cost is estimated by Jessup at several millions of dollars.

The report does not include several thousand persons returned in automobiles, nor transients transported home by the SERA and FERA. Private agencies returned 9,921 indigents to their places of origin in the same period.

The largest number of shipments occurred in 1932-33 when 2,159 persons were given train tickets. In 1937-38 the total was 1,840.

PHONE STUDY MAY BRING RATE CUTS

Far-reaching changes in the country's telephone systems, may be urged soon, as the result of a study just completed, it was learned this week.

Results of a county-wide survey on telephones, made jointly by the state railroad commission and by Southern California Telephone company and other companies operating in smaller exchanges, are being awaited by engineers who participated in the check.

Statisticians now are piecing together the information that has been gathered, but it will be several months yet before they can form any definite conclusions.

Recent installations made in the county have utilized seven numbers, instead of six as formerly. Telephone company engineers try to figure 10 years ahead, sometimes longer, as to what the trend in population will be and the resulting demands for service. It has been reported that subscribers to the Los Angeles city system would soon be able to dial direct many numbers through a long distance operator.

Meanwhile, Los Angeles city is seeking rate reductions and has been gathering data for some months in support of its rate proceedings before the commission. Most far-reaching order was that providing for extended service between the Los Angeles exchange and subscribers in contiguous exchanges, and later this was further enlarged to permit similar service to non-contiguous exchanges, such as West Los Angeles.
