SENATOR ROY J. NELSON, Sacramento—"A curb of State spending must come. I have been a member of the Legislature 14 years—and in that time I have

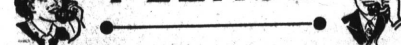
seen government expense grow until today it has become a Frankenstein, threatening to crush the life out of the taxpayer."
