MRS. FRANCES ADELAIDE KINGSLEY... mother of W. Harold Kingsley, former editor of The Torrance Herald, died suddenly in Los Angeles, April 11. Mrs. Kingsley and her late husband, Elmer Kingsley, formerly resided in Torrance and her friends here were shocked to learn of her sudden passing as she had apparently recovered from a long illness. Death is believed to have been due to a cerebral thrombosis. She was 74 years of age, and was born near Flint, Michigan, where she lived most of her life.

Private memorial services were held Wednesday at Allen's Funeral Chapel at Redondo Beach. Cremation took place at Pacific Crest. Besides her son, W. Harold Kingsley who resides with his family in the Palos Verdes Estates, the deceased is survived by two sisters, two brothers and five grandchildren.

She had looked forward to a first reunion in six years next month with her two sisters who are still active in the theatrical world and are due to appear at a Los Angeles theatre next month.

He who has the true idea of good loses all sense of evil, and by reason of this is being ushered into the undying realities of Spirit.'... Jesus gave the true idea of the which results in infinite blessings to mortals."
