

Stewart's Jump Features Dual Meet at Lomita

Bill Stewart, the Tartar ace high and broad jumper cleared the bar at 6 ft. 5 1/4 inches to better the Marine League record at Narbonne's new field last Friday in the Torrance-Gaucha dual varsity meet that was easily taken by the Lomita boys, 83 to 21.

Coach Pete Zamperini's Class B and C athletes just barely nosed out Coach Bill Sloan's Bee and Cee Gauchos, winning the B division 48 to 47 and the C classification, 40 to 37, to keep their 1939 record intact.

Narbonne scored clean sweep in seven varsity or Class A events because Torrance continued crippled for lack of man-power. Local varsity winners were Hall in the 880 and Stewart in the high and broad jumps while Goettsch and Barkidul added points.

School Records Fall
In the Class B division, Eugene Hatter won the 660 in the new school record time of 1m. 28.8s. and also bettered the school mark in the 70-yd. high hurdles when he cleared the sticks in 9.8s. Stecker bettered the league record in the 1,320-yd. run with a 3m. 25.8s. gallop.

Two school records fell in the Class C meet. Gerald McDonald pedaled the 660 in 1m. 31.2s., and the relay team of Yasunaga, Golden, Woods and Parton, won in 48.2s.

Tomorrow afternoon the Tartars travel to Wilmington to meet Banning high school, starting at 2:30 o'clock.

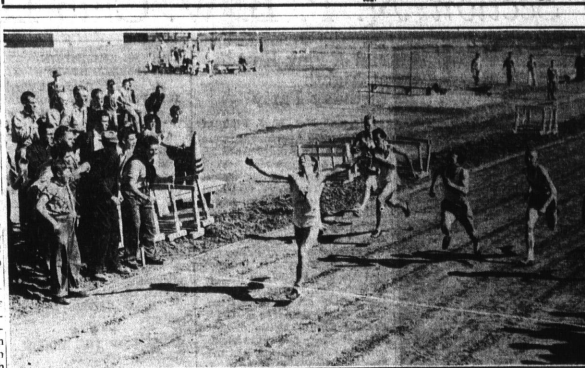

Did L. A. Sport Writers Sell Out Public? . . . Results of the "expose" of Promoter Daro's payoffs to sports writers on all networks . . . papers still are somewhat uncertain. However, it was reported Saturday from usually reliable authority that Braven Dyer of the Los Angeles Times and a sports writer on the Hollywood Citizen-News had been "fired."

Also, it was reported that Mark Kelly, Jack James and Gene Coughlin, all in the Los Angeles Examiner sports department have been suspended pending return of the publisher, who was out of town. Also reported that the Morning News has a new sports editor. As you know, sports writers on the Times, Herald-Express, Los Angeles News and Hollywood-Citizen News were named by Daro. Columns written by Mark Kelly and Gene Coughlin are appearing under their respective headings—What Nots and On the Level, but bylines are omitted.

The charge made by the investigators was that Lou Daro reported paying the above named and other sports writers thousands of dollars yearly for "good will" and "promotional advice." The names and the actual amounts they are alleged to have received were listed in The Citizen-News and the People's World, while, as far as we know at present, none of the other L. A. papers printed the list of names. Mark Kelly was listed as having received more than \$11,000 during the year 1935.

A deputy county counsel who heard Daro testifying at the inquiry said that he tried his best to evade every question put to him, but one of his questioners was an expert on income tax reports, and soon had Daro tied up pretty well. He is slated to be called again at another public

Press reports from Princeton, N. J., stating that Louis Zamperini will meet three of the world's greatest milers—Stanley Wooderson of England, the record holder; Glenn Cunningham of Kansas and Charles Fenske of Wisconsin—in the Princeton Invitational June 17 were declared "greatly in error" by the Torrance-U.S.C. miler this week.

"I'm going to compete for U. S. C. in the N.C.A.A. meet in the Los Angeles Coliseum on that date and have made no commitments to Princeton that I would enter the eastern meet," Louis said.

Zamperini will run the mile in the Pacific Coast Amateur invitation meet to be held Saturday at Edwards Field, on the Berkeley campus of the University of California against such leading distance runners as Cecil Cole of California, Gerard of
