## School Board Incumbents Win

Re-election of three incumbent members of the L. A. Board of Education for four-year terms and Mrs. Fay E. Allen, Negro teacher, for the two-year term was the result of the election Tuesday, according to complete unofficial returns.

The complete vote was: Lawrence L. Larrabee, 203,804; Roy J. Becker, 171,254; Mrs. Gertrude Rounsaville, 161,566, and Mrs. Allen 116,282. Trailing on the ticket were Rev. John L. Bogue, 113,664; Mrs. Effie P. R. Austin, 108,094; Elizabeth McManus, 102,081, and Leah Lovell, 85,556.

Wilder W. Hartley of San Pedro defeated incumbent Franklin P. Buyer of Los Angeles for the L. A. council position from the 15th district (nearest to Torrance.) Hartley drew 11,973 votes to Buyer's 8,461, according to complete unofficial returns.

### L. A. ELECTION COMMENTS VARY

While Clifford E. Clinton described the results of Tuesday's Los Angeles municipal election as "a victory for good government" and Mayor Fletcher Bowron's supporters claimed he would have 13 of the 15 council members backing his program, the best the anti-Bowron newspapers of the city would concede in their reports was "partial" success for the mayor.

"We will certainly have some independent thinkers on the council now," Clinton said. "They are nobody's men. But on all issues which they can intelligently do so, I believe they will cooperate with the mayor, and that is all we can ask. I believe we have a council which will go down the line for good government."

Bowron claimed the vote returns, which eliminated four incumbents, including two on the Mayor's "purge" list, as proof that "the people want honest and constructive government." Only one councilman, Earl C. Gay, won over Bowron's expressed opposition. He won by only a few hundred votes.

Bowron announced that he would immediately proceed with his program. He said sweeping changes in personnel policy will result in savings of at least \$250,000 a year and indicated that vacancies in the police and fire departments would not be filled.

### Former Torrance Student Makes Honor Fraternity

The holder of the first membership in honorary scholastic fraternity, Phi Beta Kappa, among the ranks of former Torrance high school students is now employed in the main office of the Columbia Steel company in San Francisco.

He is Eugene F. Stegelmeier, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. H. Stegelmeier of 1104 Beech street.

He was elected to that honor shortly before his graduation in February from U.C.L.A. Stegelmeier, who received most of his elementary and secondary education in local schools, graduated from Torrance high with the Winter class of 1935. The family has been here since 1927.
