## Most Relievers in State Are Native Americans

SACRAMENTO, May 11 (U.P.) — The state relief administration said today 88 percent of Californians on relief are native born Americans and 66 percent are the white race.

Two percent of aliens on relief who are heads of families, the report disclosed, have their first citizenship papers. Of all alien family providers, it was reported 93.7 of the dependents are American citizens.

A bill now before the legislature, approved by the senate, would deny relief to certain aliens, shifting the burden to countries from which they came or to the federal government. Although the measure provoked little debate in the senate, there was the contention it would split up families.

## Marine League Unchanged

Make-up of the Marine League for 1939-40 will remain "as is," Principal Thomas H. Elson said Tuesday following a conference of league representatives with the Los Angeles city school committee in charge of athletics.

"Schools in our league are well satisfied with the division as it now stands and we are agreed that it should not be enlarged or changed," he said. "There was some talk of adding Jordan high school in Watts to the Marine league as it now stands—Torrance, Narbonne, Banning, Gardena, San Pedro and El Segundo."

## Briganti Makes All-Marine Baseball Team

One Torrance high school baseball player, Louis Briganti, was named on the mythical All-Marine team by the All-Southern Board of Baseball this week. He was given the shortest berth on the honor nine.

Four San Pedro players drew places on the All-Marine team, giving that school a wide edge in the number who made up the club. Tadashi Kishishita, leading pitcher of the league with five wins, including one no-hit no-run game, drew the No. 1 hurling position with Leonard Rodriguez of Banning second.

Other Pirates chosen included Andrew Vidovich, first base; Ralph Rippo, second base and Otto Shimizu, right field. Jimmy O'Kura of Banning was picked for third, David Nunes, headed the list of gardeners chosen with Francis De Pamela of Gardena and Shimizu getting the other spots.

Tommy Kincannon of Narbonne, outstanding in every phase of the catching position, took that place.

Banning high school's tennis team scored a major upset in Marine League net play Friday by defeating Narbonne, 5 to 2. The Gauchos were heavily favored to take the contest. Trout fishermen who chose the east slope of the High Sierra as their fishing grounds for the opening day of the season, were not disappointed in their decision. Due to a comparatively light snow during the past winter in this region, all of the streams and rivers are low and clear, offering ideal fishing conditions that normally do not exist until the middle of June.

Altho some of the higher lakes are still partly or completely frozen over, the greater part of this fishing area is clear of snow and ice. Many limits of large size rainbows were taken out of Hot Creek between the fish hatchery and the geysers.

Worms and even flies were the most popular. A few of the other points in Inyo and Mono counties that were producing excellent fishing were Owens River, between Benton Crossing and also the Gorge and in Bircham Canyon, two miles south of Paradise Camp; Rock Creek, south of Tom's Place; Mammoth, Convict, McGee, Bishop and Big Pine Creeks; June and Convict Lakes. The Mammoth Lakes were not open May 1, but should be clear of ice by the middle of the month, if prevailing warm weather continues.
