

Tartars Grab Marine League Track Honors

WIN CEE CHAMPIONSHIP; SECOND IN BEE DIVISION

Bill Stewart's record-smashing high jump of 6 ft. 6 1/2 inches and his 21 ft. 10 1/2 inch broad jump... Clifford Trezise's triple win in the Class B 120-yd. low hurdles, high jump and 70-yd. high hurdles... Johnny Hall's effortless triumph in the mile and the Class C relay team's record-setting performance...

These were the highlights of the Marine League track and field meet on Narbonne's new field at Lomita last Friday afternoon. It was a Torrance day despite the San Pedro Pirates' capture of the varsity and Class B meets. Coach Pete Zamperini's Cees won that event and his Bees came within three and one-half points of taking that meet.

Because the Tartar Cee relay team, Ted Yasunaga, Bobby Gellman, Wallace Woods and Bill Parton, flashed to the tape first, the Class C dual meet championship also went to Torrance. The decision on this had to be postponed until the Marine League meet because judges of the Pedro-Torrance meet May 5 threw out of the race because of rule infractions by both teams. The midweek relays equalled the league record to beat out San Pedro at Lomita and thus hand the Pirates their only defeat of the track season.

Results of Meet
San Pedro took the varsity meet easily with 59 1/2 points. Narbonne was second with 43 and the other schools rated: El Segundo, 28 1/2; Torrance, 20 1/2; Gardena, 15 1/2; Banning, 13. The Pirates' Bee squad took the midweek meet with 37 1/2 points. Torrance was second with 34 1/2 and the remaining scores were: Banning, 30 1/2; Narbonne, 28 1/2; El Segundo, 26 1/2; Gardena, 8 1/2. The Class C results were: Torrance, 33 1/2; San Pedro, 30; Gardena, 29; Narbonne, 24; Banning, 16, and El Segundo, 24.

Stewart's leap of 6 ft. 6 1/2 in. is the best performance to date in the Los Angeles city leagues. He broke his Marine League record of last year by 4 1/2 inches. He attempted 6 ft. 8 1/2 inches but his afternoon's work in the jump and broad jump told against him in that try to set a new world's interscholastic record.

Six New Records
Cliff Trezise proved that the Trezise family is still potent in the athletic world. He was the only triple winner of the meet. Jim Banich, San Pedro's ace varsity performer, won the 100 and 220 as usual but he was beaten in the shot put by Ted Kimberling of Gardena.

In addition to Stewart's record jump, four other previous Marine marks went into the discard. Jack Thornburn, El Segundo, eclipsed his own 440 time with a 50.9s performance. Everett Peck of Narbonne lowered the half-mile standard with a 2m 4s run and Kimberling's shot toss went 49 ft. 9 in.

Steele's brilliant Class B 1, 320-yd. run was the only record-breaking event in that division. He galloped the distance in 3m. 22.5s.

A crowd estimated at more than 2,500 witnessed the meet which was exceptionally well managed and run off in a most orderly fashion.

But this year, with Pete Zamperini's first year as track coach at the local school, they have two boys to add to the hall of fame. Bill Stewart, should take first place in the high jump, and may place in the broad jump. In the Southern Calif. meet held last week, the high jumper did 6 ft. 3 inches. Stewart has cleared 6 ft. 6 1/2 inches, for the best jump so far, in the entire state (high schools).

The other young man to represent Torrance Saturday, is a made over sprinter, Blonde John Hall. His best time this year in the mile, is 4:34, but he has never been pressed, and is capable of striding the distance under the 4:28 mark, when, and if pressed.

Last week Heredia of San Diego high school ran the mile for first place in the C.I.F. meet in 4:29. When Hall and the San Diego had meet this Saturday, there will really be a race.

Sport Shots picks Stewart and Hall to take first places in their events... and probably they will be the only Marine League athletes to even place in the Coliseum Saturday afternoon.
