

Car Owners Facing Closer Regulation

California motorists face increased force and effect behind parking regulations when the new "prima facie" parking law goes into operation this fall.

The new measure provides that proof of the registered ownership of a car at the time it was illegally parked shall constitute a prima facie presumption that the registered owner was the person who parked the car at the place and time when the violation occurred.

To insure that the registered owner shall be given adequate notice of the alleged illegal parking of his automobile and full opportunity to protect his rights, the law prescribes certain procedure.

A tag noting the time, place and character of the parking

violation, and fixing a time and place for the appearance of the registered owner to answer the charge, must be attached securely to the vehicle and in a prominent place.

If the owner does not appear in response to the tag, a written notice containing the same data as that recited on the tag shall be served upon him either personally or by mail. If by mail, service shall be deemed complete ten days after mailing.

Should registered owner fail to appear within five days after being served, he will be taken into custody upon a warrant.

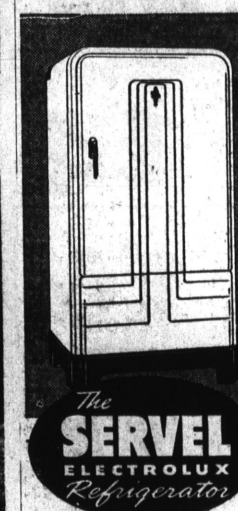

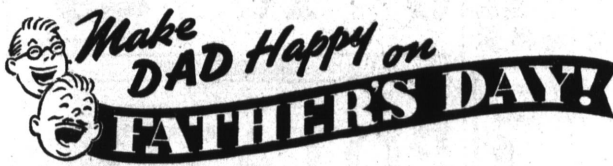

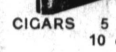
