Car Owners Facing **Closer Regulation**

California motorists face increased force and effect behind parking regulations when the new "prima facie" parling law goes into operation this fall.

The new measure provides that proof of the registered owners to answer the charge, must be attached secure-just the time it was sliggally parked shall constitute a prima facie presumption that the registered owner was the person who parked the car at the place and time when the violation occurred.

To insure that the registered owner shall be given adequate notice of the alleged lilegal parking of his automobile and full opportunity to protect his rights, the law prescribes certain pro-
