And when Jesus saw her, he called her to him, and said unto her, Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity. And he laid his hands on her; and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God." Among the selections from the Christian Science textbook, "Righteousness and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy, are the statements: "Understanding spiritual law and knowing that there is no material law, man said: 'These signs shall follow them that believe... they shall take up serpents, and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them. They shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover.' It were well had Christendom believed and obeyed this sacred saying."

**Brimstone In Orchard Routs Marauding Deer**  
DALE, N. Y. (U.P.)—Brimstone is the latest deer repellent of district farmers. Many farmers who formerly suspended moth balls from choice trees to keep deer away report that brimstone is better and cheaper. The recommended method is to burn a small quantity of the brimstone in two or three places in the orchard and leave the spot undisturbed.
