With nearly two score polio-meelitis cases from all parts of Lds Angeles county now under treatment at General Hospital, officials announced today that no expense would be spared to halt the spread of the outbreak which they declared had not yet

which they declared had no yet reached epidemic proportions.

While the number of sufferers from the dread malady now is larger, than at any time since the epidemic of 1984-35 the present situation would not be alarming except for the highly contagious nature of the disease, hospital authorities said.

Ordinarily there are only two or three polio cases under treatment at the hospital and the present situation was not revealed until Everett J. Gray, superintendent at the hospital, applied to Wayne Allen, chief administrative officer of the country, for emergency funds to fight the disease.
