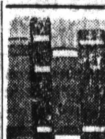

TRUMPETS AT DAWN by Cyril Harris: This is a stirring novel of the American Revolution. Its scene is in New York, the Hudson and New Jersey; its vividly realized characters are members of two families torn between old loyalties and the new. Life in homes of old Manhattan and in ragged ranks of Washington's army has rarely been made so thrillingly real. It produces a timely appeal.

THIS LIFE I'VE LOVED by Mrs. Isobel Field: Mrs. Field's autobiography reflects the interest and variety of her life and includes some delightful recollections of her stepfather, Robert Louis Stevenson.

HEADS AND TALES by Malvina Hoffman: The exhilarating autobiography of a distinguished sculptor whose artistic career was enriched by many friendships and enlivened by adventure.

SIROCCO by Ralph Bates: The stories, sketches and character studies that comprise "Sirocco" vary in length and intensity but they are all in one kind and quality and quickened by a common spirit. These studies by an artist of a single subject, the soul of Spain, are presented in terms of human beings all close to earth and deeply rooted in the soil. But the poet in the writer combines with naturalistic writing, strong hints of immaterial meaning as well as great sense of rhythm and color.

ORDEAL by Nevil Shute: What happened to the Corbets? To Joan and Peter and their children when over night their normal happy lives were shattered? What happens to any family in any city in the world's new kind of war—"Ordeal" is a novel dealing realistically with the first few weeks of the next world war. Indeed it is so realistic that it seems as if it must be history instead of prophecy. Remarkably there are no bitter nor declamatory attacks on war. The book gains its great effectiveness and force by quietly and simply giving one concrete instance of a happy English family and what happens to it the moment war breaks out.

ALONE by Richard E. Byrd: No reckless whim but four years

THE LAND IS BRIGHT by Archie Bluns: In this book we follow the American visionaries of 1850 traveling in their covered wagons along the Oregon Trail. The author possesses to marked degree the ability of making his readers identify themselves with the characters and we struggle beside them on the long journey. Writing of simple people in the grip of fundamental emotion the story is a sort of log book recording crisis as well as casual incidents of the trip.

DAYS OF OUR YEARS by Pierre Van Paasen: This book by the former correspondent of the New York World is a record of intense action and uncompromising thought. Van Paasen fought in the World War and since that time has covered Ethiopia, Spain and Palestine witnessing nearly all the dramatic events of our years and interviewing nearly all the statesmen worth interviewing.

THREAD OF SCARLET by Ben Ames Williams: This story of the War of 1812 centers in Nantucket, when the British warships made it an island without a country. Pearl Fishers Of Arkansas Open Season

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (U.P.)—Trepid spring rains are breaking up the shanty boat villages which have wintered on the Arkansas river here and at other towns along the White and Red rivers. The small, floating dwellings are drifting down the rivers to begin a summer of fishing, and the very dangerous business of diving for mussel-shells. Since early fall, the one- and two-room houseboats have been tied up near towns where their owners live doing odd jobs, mending rustic furniture, or working on federal construction projects.

Warmer weather, however, makes of the state's river a veritable treasure trove of fish and shells, some pearl-bearing.

River Pearls Distinctive
The White river is the only Arkansas stream which harbors the huge moss-backed "grandad" shells which produce milk-white pearls. The other mussels are taken largely to be sold to button factories.

The shell divers have been overhauling their home-made diving equipment since mid-winter, and making new helmets from old automobile gasoline tanks, or five-gallon oil cans.

These primitive diving helmets are fitted with isinglass faceplates—of little practical use in the pitchblack depths of the muddy streams—and with heavy weights to hold them to the divers' shoulders.

No diving dress is worn by the poverty-ridden river divers. They descend recklessly to rich shell-pockets, often going as deep as 50 or 60 feet where the pressure upon their unprotected ear drums and bodies sometimes impairs their hearing or causes the "bends."

Shells Bring High Price
But the rewards are sometimes rich. The delicate sand-shells which lie in windrows at the bottom of the deep eddies can be sold for as high as \$100 a ton, while the discovery of one perfect "pigeon's-egg" pearl in the muddy White river will amply repay a diver for a summer's work.

The fishermen also run a risk. They stalk the huge yellow catfish which sell for a better price than the choice pork at small town fish docks. Trotlines hundreds of yards long are stretched across the width of the White, Red, and Arkansas rivers. Heavy weights sink them far enough to escape the danger of being fouled by river craft, and far enough to drop the baited hooks on the muddy bottom where the big fish lie.

The job of "running" the trotlines requires that the fisherman pass the heavy cord, thickly studded with hooks, across his boat. And many a shanty boatman has been tangled in his lines, pulled from his boat, and drowned by the weight of the lines and the heavy hip-boots he wears.

But the shanty boat dwellers are a hardy race. Many of them live and die on their small floating boats—much like the junk-dwellers of the Yangtze in China.
