

### Claim Race Tracks Using Illegal Method of Computing 'Breakage'

Los Angeles county race track visitors have been "chiscled" out, of nearly \$2,000,000 in dimes, inckets and pennies by an illegal method of computing "breakage" of odd cents at Santa Anita and Höllywood Park tracks, according to two suits on file today in Superior court.
