

The diva made her Bowl debut last summer and the event was hailed as the artistic highlight of the season.

May Redeem Property Now Minus Fees

Owners of tax-delinquent property who are redeeming it under the 10-payment plan may take advantage of the 1939 legislation that permits redemption of property without interest, penalties or costs of any kind until Sept. 1, it was pointed out today by Howard L. Byram, county tax collector.

Harold W. Kennedy, deputy county counsel, who guided the bill through the Legislature, explained that those who already are redeeming their property may take advantage of the law as well as those who have not yet made any payments. Only requirement is that redemption be made in full, and many property owners are reported to be borrowing on their life insurance policies to make the redemptions, thereby paying but 6 per cent interest.

More than 30,000 owners of real estate in the county now are redeeming their property under the 10-payment plan, Byram said, and added that he had advised all of them by postcard notices that they could take advantage of the savings under the new law.

Mystery Blaze Damages Auto
